1. The effect of the Fall upon marriages - Genesis 3:16

- a. Observation: God cursed the man and woman in their areas of fulfillment.
- b. What was the effect of the fall upon marriages?

2. The outworking of Salvation in marriages - Col. 3:18-19

- a. Wives:
 - i. Submit to your husbands
 - 1. <u>Does submitting place her in an inferior position in the marriage?</u>
 - 2. How do we know that submission is does not cause inferiority?
 - ii. as is fitting in the Lord

b. Husbands:

- i. love your wives
 - 1. <u>In what ways in loving one's wife similar to submission?</u>
 - 2. How is love a choice?
- ii. and do not be embittered against them
 - 1. How does this command correlate to the effect of the fall in Genesis 3?
 - 2. Here Paul is making the statement that forcing your spouse to submit is out of line for the Christian husband.

3. The effect of the Fall upon parenting

- a. Can you imagine a parenting that is just playing, teaching, loving on, caring for, only obedience?
- b. Can you imagine a world without our own shortcomings as parents?
- c. Instead, we have stories like: 1 Samuel 2:22-25, 1 Samuel 2:29, Genesis 37:3-4, 2 Samuel 13:21-22, Others?

4. The outworking of Salvation in parenting

- a. Children:
 - i. obey your parents
 - 1. In what areas?
 - 2. Read Hebrews 12:5-11, What are 4 possible responses to discipline?

- ii. for this pleases the Lord
 - 1. The greatest motivation to obey my parents because of a desire to please God.
 - 2. What are some ways that we can nurture that desire?

b. Fathers:

- i. Why do you think that Fathers are mentioned specifically here and not parents?
- ii. Do not embitter your children
 - 1. How can firm discipline be administered in the wrong spirit?
 - 2. (otherwise) they will become discouraged.
- 5. The effect of the fall upon working relationships.
 - a. Genesis 3:17-19, Lev. 25:39-43, Nehemiah 5:6-11
 - b. What about in terms of workers ethic?
- 6. The outworking of salvation upon working relationships.
 - a. Slaves:
 - i. Obeying earthly masters in everything Col. 3:22
 - 1. He doesn't tell them to get out of slavery. <u>Does this surprise</u> anyone?
 - 2. They are to conduct their work with the utmost integrity
 - ii. Have a work ethic Col. 3:23
 - 1. <u>Describe a time when you saw someone doing a job with all their</u> heart.
 - 2. As if you are working for God himself.
 - iii. Hoping not for the earthly reward of freedom, but for a heavenly inheritance from God Col. 3:24
 - iv. Vs.25 Why does Paul challenge slaves with this statement?

b. Masters:

- i. Provide your slaves with what is right and fair. What sorts of things do you think would be included in this command?
- ii. Because you know that you have a master in heaven.
