- 2. Putting to Death whatever belongs to the earthly nature <u>Col. 3:5-7</u> "In short, the apostle teaches that the Christian's experience in Christ calls not simply for regulating the old earthbound life but for digging out its roots and utterly destroying it." (Curtis Vaughan p.211)
  - a. Putting to Death the Earthly Nature
    - i. These actions of the sinful nature to be put to death like Christ was put to death and how we died in Christ according to verse 3.
    - ii. Have you ever just tried to keep a sin manageable? What happened?
      - 1. We cannot manage sin, keeping it small and 'harmless'.
      - 2. Sin does not yield to our attempts to tame it.
      - 3. Sin will get the best of us if we allow it to remain in the smallest form.
